

## PCWG Meeting 16 May 23 7:30pm (at The Well Inn) Draft

- 1. Present: Michael, Lesley, Stuart, Elaine, Sheena, Charlotte, Jeff, Tanji, Roy, Simon
- 2. Apologies: Dave & Louise, Graeme & Marje, Dave C, Nic, Stu
- 3. Initial update from Roy:
  - Glycophosphate on tree cuts generally ineffective
  - Birch pulling most effective; idea was to cut it very low then spray the regrowth (ie leaves)
  - Tara put money in the budget to cut the rest i.e. key control areas
  - Control of the Birch: if we could get it to the point of management
- 4. Convention on Wetlands: MM monitoring
- 5. Bird boxes: approved
- 6. Tetley Steps—Wait for new site manager- Izzy Filor; fence & gate can be removed
- 7. Dam 119 needs fixed/replaced-new site manager will look at
- 8. PCWG Update: Bog Squad, WL Conservation help with birch pulling, key to helping us to control birch. Roy suggested we (Roy, new SM, with some of our group) do a walk over the Moss to assess state of birch, also for them to understand what works. Ideal if chemicals can be avoided.
- 9. Roy suggested an MOU refresh (between us and WT)
- 10. WT continued update:
  - Izzy Filor starting as new Site Manager next week
  - Budgets: budget cuts implemented last year will continue
  - Path work has been cut, but paths aren't too bad. Where paths need treatment for safety it can be done; birch control is not affected by cuts; generally everything else has been left untouched
  - Management plan: proposed walk over the bog. Roy also suggested we add a sphagnum moss survey to the Management Plan ACTION: Jeff to email Roy a copy of our proposed management plan, as well as ideas for Kilmagad
     We can callect plactic tree tubes in Kilmagad
  - We can collect plastic tree tubes in Kilmagad
- 11. Church and car park sale: car park is main car park for the hill & orchard, and hall overflow
- 12. ACTION: Charlotte & Jeff to check to see if barbed wire near the curling pond in Moss is on WT land or curling pond/hut. If ours we can remove it.
- 13. Treasurer's Report: donation of £60 from Climate Café. Balance £6702.51
- 14. Plan for the year:
  - Portmoak Festival: Jazz in the Orchard, Women Whittling in Orchard, MM doing photograph exhibit (photos & calendars for sale for the duration of the festival)
  - Dipwells: Sheena & Stu put in new ones around the edge to see effects of new profiling
- 15. Updates:
  - Birch pull: Lothian looking for September dates—MM to choose date
  - Dawn Chorus in May, looking to do an autumn (or a bit later) as well
  - Portmoak Biodiversity: Marje to work on a new leaflet

  - Himalayan balsam: we have controlled it in our 2 properties
